### A Note from the Pastor

How lovely is your dwelling place, O LORD of hosts! My soul longs, indeed it faints for the courts of the LORD; my heart and my flesh sing for joy to the living God... Even the sparrow finds a home, and the swallow a nest for herself, where she may lay her young, at your altars, O LORD of hosts, my King and my God. Happy are those who live in your house, ever singing your praise... For a day in your courts is better than a thousand elsewhere. I would rather be a doorkeeper in the house of my God than live in the tents of wickedness. For the LORD God is a sun and shield; he bestows favor and honor. No good thing does the LORD withhold from those who walk uprightly. O LORD of hosts, happy is everyone who trusts in you. Psalm 84 (selected verses)

Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the LORD my whole life long. Psalm 23:6

Virtually all religions have holy places; special places where the god is expected to be present in some kind of special way. For pagans and other nature-based religions it is often in the outdoors. Ancient (and even some modern) pagans worshipped in sacred groves, or under sacred trees, sometimes on mountains. The ancient druids worshipped under the sacred oak.

For Christians, Jews, and Muslims, the worship usually happens in a special building. The Jews had the Temple, now their synagogues, Christians have churches, Muslims have Mosques. When the children of Israel wandered in the wilderness, they had a special tent that they used only for the worship of God.

Holy places are places where we believe we have met God in the past, and expect that we will meet him again in the future. Our church is a holy place, not just because it is shaped like a church and has a steeple; not even because it has been specifically dedicated to God. Our church is a Holy Place because of what has happened here. For generations, prayers have gone up, praise has been sung, lessons have been learned. Think of all of the Baptisms, Holy Communion, weddings, and souls sent to their rest from this place. So many prayers have been offered here, in times of peace, times of war, for soldiers' safe return, and prayers of lament for those that would not. The presence of a church building is a testament to the presence of God. We have met God here and we expect that we will again. Many Christians do not attend worship regularly but will still say, "that's my church," knowing that it is there for them in times of need.

As summer turns into fall, and programs start again, let us avail ourselves of the beautiful Holy Place that God and our forebears have gifted us with.

I was glad when the said unto me, let us go into the house of the Lord. Psalm 122:1



#### **Treasurer's Report**

- <u>Bills</u> Bills for the month of July were presented by Terri Myhre. Total General Fund bills are estimated at \$14,988.99. We will wait to transfer money back to the Cornerstone Fund until next month.
- Motion made by Rose Van Uden to approve the Treasurer's Report. Moriah Reiss seconded the motion. Motion carried.

#### **Board of Trustees Report**

- <u>Bills</u> The bills included the bill for \$3,000 from Jeremiason Photo for the directories. Even though it took less time than expected, the bill for the elevator repair from MEI stayed the same as quoted. The remainder on the bill is \$21,944.44. This will be paid by the Building and Property Endowment fund.
- Organ Repair The organ was repaired, and that bill was \$573.80.
- <u>150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary</u>: Thank you to everyone who helped with the 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary. There are still some bills being finalized, but it looks like our income should exceed the bills for this event.
- <u>Church & Parsonage Repair</u> We have received a check from insurance for partial repairs on the church and parsonage. In the parsonage, the carpet pad was replaced, and the carpet was reinstalled. We haven't received the bill from Mike's Flooring, yet. For the parsonage roof, Jason will check if we can get matching shingles. We will contact Tony Opdahl, Josh Brewers, Bruce Laleman, and Cory Buysse to see who is available to do the shingles. Barry was going to check with the company that did the shingles on the church about the roof caps.
