A Note from the Pastor

[The angel said to Mary...] you will conceive in your womb and bear a son, and you will name him Jesus. 32He will be great, and will be called the Son of the Most High, and the Lord God will give to him the throne of his ancestor David. He will reign over the house of Jacob forever, and of his kingdom there will be no end. Luke 1:31-33

Pastor's Report

- 6 home visits, 2 nursing home visits, 4 office visits, 1 Pastoral evaluation meeting, 1 family prayer service, 1 funeral, 2 confirmation services, 1 Faith Statement night meeting.
- The confirmation service went really well and was really long. Perhaps we can find some ways to make it still meaningful but a little shorter next year.

Treasurer's Report

- Bills Bills for the month of November were presented by Terri Myhre. Total General Fund bills are estimated at \$13,538.89
- Motion made by Dave Dovre to approve the Treasurer's Report. Emily Hennen seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Board of Trustees Report

- <u>Bills</u> For our umbrella policy for our insurance, we agreed to pay half now (\$235). We did have an issue with the dishwasher, and the bill for the repair parts of \$228.96 will come out of the building fund.
- <u>Church / Parsonage repair</u> We are still waiting for the insurance adjustor to give us the final okay to replace the parsonage roof as we haven't been able to find matching shingles. If we can't find a contractor to do the whole roof now, Guy Jeremiason has offered to patch the roof to get it done before winter.
- <u>Pastor's evaluation recap</u> Terri, Deb, and members of St. Paul met with Pastor Allen and reviewed his evaluation. Goals were set for 2023. There will be no monetary increase, but Pastor will have an additional week of vacation. We also agreed that we will continue doing a review annually.
- Year End Cutoff: December 30th will be the year end cutoff for donations.
- Motion made by Moriah Reiss to approve the Board of Trustees' report. Barb Knutson seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Board of Deacons Report

- Walk Around Offerings: 4th Sunday of the month -
 - November 27 Toys for Tots
 - December 25 No walk around offering in December
 - January 22 Open to suggestions
- All Saint's Day: This will be on November 6, and Chris has sent letters on this to the appropriate families.
- <u>Thanksgiving Service</u>: There will be an ecumenical service at Hope on Wednesday, November 23rd at 6 pm. Pastor spoke to the priest from St. Edward's, and they will participate.
- <u>Christmas Services</u>: Christmas Eve services will be at 4 pm at St. Paul's and 5:30 pm at Hope. We will have a Christmas Day service at Hope but not at St. Paul's.
- Communion servers: The consensus of the group was that confirmed members can serve communion.
- Motion made by Barb Knutson to approve the Board of Deacons' report. Deb Belaen seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Council Minutes (con't) Board of Education Report

- GLOW: The next Let It Shine service will be on Sunday, November 20, 2022. GLOW will provide the ushers, readers and communion servers for this service. We would like to have some help or input when planning the service from the Deacons. Video would like to have a week's notice prior to service for songs and any video or sound needs. Daniel, the music director, should contact Dave Dovre. Dave will talk to the sound person and make sure the boom mics are set up. There was discussion about having Daniel call in to the Music & Worship meeting to help discuss music for the GLOW service. Our goal is to get kids and families into the church on Sundays. The Christmas Program will be on Sunday, December 18 during the regular church service at 10 am.
- <u>Confirmation</u>: 13 9th and 10th graders were confirmed on October 30th at Hope and 1 9th grader was confirmed at St. Paul's. Statement of Faith night was well attended. Thanks to Rose Van Uden for making lasagna for the supper. There was discussion about changes to the confirmation service for next year. Do we want students to continue to read their Statement of Faiths on Confirmation Sunday? Do we want all family/friends to surround the student while the student is being confirmed? We did agree that these two parts of the service are very meaningful, and we don't want to lose that. We may look at other ways to shorten the service. These students will now join and attend Teen Power on Wednesday nights.
- <u>Mission Trip 2023</u>: We are continuing to fundraise. Nancy Krog will be doing a Mary & Martha Fundraiser from November 1 -11 to support the Mission Trip. 25% of each sale will be donated to the mission trip. Nancy was at GLOW tonight, and she will also be here on November 6th at the Meatball Supper. She will also be at Bethany-Elim on Sunday, November 6 from 9 to 11 am. A planning meeting is scheduled for Sunday, November 13th.
- Christmas Baking: They are taking orders now for Oreo truffles, lefse and Belgian cookies. Orders are due December 4th. There are order forms in the bulletin and there is a link on the church website. Baking will be done on Sunday, December 11th starting at 10:30 am. Orders can be picked up at Hope or delivered in Minneota later in the afternoon on December 11. Orders can also be picked up on Monday, December 12th in Ivanhoe at the Ivanhoe Family Pharmacy.
- <u>Teen Power</u>: We are also talking about helping to serve the Meatball Supper on Sunday, November 6th. They have been involved in the Let it Shine service, Confirmation readers and Communion servers. They also helped with the pumpkin "dissection" last week during the Family Fun night at GLOW. Planning to do the shoe collection again, but no date has been set as of now.
- Other: Summer VBS. We have until November 14th to reserve a date for next summer. The 1st week of August is available, and it was agreed that we would do it in that same time frame. Barb will contact Green Lake Ministries to reserve that time frame.
- Motion made by Lizzy Reiss to approve the Board of Education report. Moriah Reiss seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Other Business

- <u>Christmas Tree Collection:</u> It was agreed that we will do a Christmas tree collection. A tree will be set up in the narthex to collect items (hats, gloves, etc.) for this. Chris will contact Jen Mahan-Deitte to get a list of items needed, and that will be included in the newsletter and bulletin.
- Nominating Committee: Gayle will be the council rep for the nominating committee.
- <u>Poinsettias:</u> These will be coming from Hy-Vee this year as Brad's will no longer be doing this. We will need a count by November 18th because of this change. Chris was also going to check on the costs and timing if we went with Marshall Floral or Jim's SuperValu in Canby. The order forms are already in the bulletin.
- Motion to adjourn made by Moriah Reiss. Deb Belaen seconded the motion. Motion carried.



Hope Lutheran Teen Power Now collecting shoes for our 2022-2023 annual shoe drive.

The collection of shoes, sandals, boots, and all other footwear starts now in November and will run through spring 2023. We gather all footwear and deliver our donations to Schuler Shoes in St. Cloud, MN. The majority of new and gently worn shoes may be donated to shelters and then sold at shelters for \$5.00 with the money then being donated to the shelter food shelf. Some shoes will stay in Minnesota with a program called 'Shoe Away Hunger'. Some shoes will go to other countries where they are needed for people without shoes, and the rest, if pretty worn out or are singles, are shredded and used for playground surfacing rubber mulch.

It is estimated that approximately 400 million children worldwide, more than the entire population of the US, live in pronounced poverty. Many of these children will grow up never having had a pair of shoes, resulting in significant ramifications for their health and well-being. Lacking proper footwear, countless children will be unable to attend school. And tens of millions of these poverty-stricken, barefoot boys and girls will be infected with soil-transmitted parasitic diseases like hookworm, causing lasting suffering and lifelong debilitation.

Please clean out your closets and bring bags or boxes of your household's gently worn footwear to Hope Lutheran Church!
