

Pastor's Report

- 1 council meeting, 1 meeting with the Bishop, 6 worship services, 5 Pastoral visits, 2 funerals, 4 baptisms, 1 committee meeting, 2 Confirmation classes, and 2 Christmas Eve worship services. Also attended 2 basketball games and 2 school concerts.
- The doorbell at the parsonage does not work, and the handrail on the basement stairs is loose. Neither are urgent, but we will have Tony Opdahl stop over to look at both of those items.

Board of Trustees Report

- **Bills:** Bills for the month of January were provided. Total General Fund bills are estimated at \$12,504.67. The bill for organ lessons for Autumn Dovre will be paid out of the Memorial Fund Music Fund.
- **2022 Budget:** The 2022 proposed budget was reviewed. Most of the line items were kept at similar amounts as 2021. In and out items are listed at the end of the budget separately.
- **Building & Property Endowment Fund:** There will be about \$42,000 to be used in 2022 from this fund. We haven't seen a lot of contributions to the building fund this year, and the Endowment Fund Committee would like to have more fundraisers done with the Endowment Fund making contributions at certain thresholds to encourage giving by the congregation. We have received two quotes for the sound and video system upgrade, and the total cost for both is approximately \$25,000. The sound system equipment is \$8,433.97, and the video equipment is approximately \$10,000. Installation is estimated at \$2,000. In order to have the audio equipment installed by the 150th Anniversary, the sound system equipment will be ordered and the money will be borrowed from the Building Fund. Once the money for the audio equipment is raised through fundraisers and with the contributions of the Building and Property Endowment Fund, the video equipment will be ordered.
- **Auditors:** Auditors are still needed, and Shane will be contacting people about doing this.
- **Annual Meeting Agenda:** Items in old business are 150th Anniversary and Endowment Fund Report. There was one item for new business – new sound and video system equipment.
- **Balcony:** Southwest Glass will be contacted about the glass by the railing in the balcony as it has been on order for quite some time. Also, we are not going to take out another pew in the balcony.
- **Motion made by Gayle Van Vooren to approve the Board of Trustees' report. Clark Corbin seconded the motion. Motion carried.**

Board of Education Report

- **GLOW:** The Christmas Program was amazing! Special thank you goes to Tegan Gillund, Jess Gronke, and Emily Hennen for all of the work and dedication to our Christmas program. We could not do it without them. We would also like to thank Katie Boettger for accompanying our kids. It was nice to have a short break in December, and we are excited for the new year for GLOW!! We will look at ordering more curriculum depending on what the teachers' needs are in their individual classrooms. Meals on Wednesdays seem to be going great, and we have parents helping each week through an online sign up. This sign-up really helps to ensure that clean up goes smoothly. We are also looking at different ideas for GLOW kids to be interactive in the church services on Sundays. Will most likely be implementing these ideas the last part of January or the first part of February, depending on the kids and availability.

Council Minutes (con't)

- **Teen Power:** The "Shoe Away Hunger" (formerly Soles4Souls) shoe collection is now in progress. We will be helping with the church pictorial; picture sessions will be starting on January 12th. Tonight's session was cancelled due to the inclement weather.
- **Mission Trip 2023:** The Christmas Baking fundraiser was a success. We had over 50 baking orders to start and ended up with extra lefse and Belgian cookies which were also sold for a profit. We truly appreciate all of you that ordered Christmas goodies and the volunteers that helped the kids make the goodies. The free will donation after the church Christmas program was also profitable. Thank you to all for their generous donations and the Endowment Fund Committee for their matching funds. Emily contacted Phil at Youthworks to inquire about possible mission trip destinations. We received a few options (6) but was told that they are not finalizing details or taking registrations for summer 2023 yet. 2023 destination options will be not available until June 2022. We are looking into the next fundraiser; it was mentioned that the Spaghetti Supper has usually been held in February.
- **Youth of Hope:** We are registered for the National ELCA Youth Gathering which is scheduled to be held in Minneapolis, MN on July 24-28, 2022. We are waiting to get more information about hotels and other gathering information. We are planning a get together soon to discuss this gathering.
- **VBS:** We have gotten information from the following camps regarding registration for summer camps.
 - Shetek Lutheran Ministries – They have started sending out emails to families in their database, and their summer registration system is now open. Nora Dahloff responded to our inquiry about possible on-site options, and the only available week is June 26-30. She also said it would depend on the # of kids and time of day.
 - Green Lake Lutheran Ministries – Lindsey Scheid, the Associate Director contacted Chris about scheduling Hope for day camp. Emily e-mailed Lindsey about reserving the dates of July 31 – Aug 4 for VBS Day Camp at Hope this summer. These dates are the same time frame as last year, and the Board of Education felt that this timing worked well last year and were a better option than the date provided by Shetek.
- **Motion made by Deb Belaen to approve the Board of Education report. Clark Corbin seconded the motion. Motion carried.**

Other Business

- **Building and Grounds Committee:** The Building and Grounds Committee met, and they have the following projects that they would like to complete before the 150th anniversary. These projects are replacing the Sunday School door on the west side of church, sandblasting and repainting the back steps, paint the ceiling in the narthex, take out the curtains in the chapel and paint the chapel, fix the plaster by the sink in the kitchen and repaint the kitchen. We are also looking at putting an on demand water heater in the kitchen and installing a sump pump in the floor by the drinking fountain in the fellowship hall. We also want to have shelves built in the walkway by the Sunday school rooms, so we can clean out the chapel area and also take out the furniture in the store room off the library, so it can be used for storage. The kitchen and bathroom floors also need to scrubbed and waxed, and we want to replace the carpet by the secretary's desk and down the steps. We will be asking for volunteers to help with some of the projects. We are looking at March 20th or March 27th or possibly both days as cleaning days.
- **Thank You:** Thank you to those who have serve on the council – Lori Dyce, Shane Bordewyk, Clark Corbin and Bryce Denney. We greatly appreciate your service!
- **Motion made by Emily Hennen to adjourn. Rose Van Uden seconded the motion. Motion carried.**



Do Good, Feel Good!

Do you need a New Years' Resolution? A new year, a new purpose! Give away your new or gently used shoes to help provide shoes for someone in need. Almost everyone has a closet with at least one pair of shoes that aren't worn or an old pair that may end up in a landfill. Give those shoes to Hope Lutheran Teens and know that steps are being taken to make those usable.

Hope Lutheran Teen Power is now collecting shoes for our annual shoe drive. The collection of shoes, sandals, boots, and all other footwear starts now in December and **will run through February 2022.** We gather footwear and deliver our donations to Schuler Shoes in St. Cloud, MN. A few years ago, one of the employees at the drop off point at Schuler Shoes shared with us that after the shoes are paired and sorted, the shoes go to four different places. The new and nicer ones may be donated to shelters and then sold at shelters for \$5.00 with the money then being donated to the shelter food shelf, some shoes stay in Minnesota with a program called 'Shoe Away Hunger', some go to other countries where they are needed for people without shoes, and the rest, if pretty worn out or are singles, are shredded and used for playground surfacing of rubber mulch.

It is estimated that approximately 400 million children worldwide, more than the entire population of the US, live in pronounced poverty. Many of these children will grow up never having had a pair of shoes, resulting in significant ramifications for their health and well-being. Lacking proper footwear, countless children will be unable to attend school. And tens of millions of these poverty stricken, barefoot boys and girls will be infected with soil-transmitted parasitic diseases like hookworm, causing lasting suffering and lifelong debilitation.




GLOW is currently looking at ordering more curriculum depending on what the teachers' needs are in their individual classrooms.
