Pastor's Report

- 1 council meeting, 7 worship services, 6 Pastoral visits, 2 funerals, 2 baptisms, 1 Conference pastors' meeting, 3 Confirmation classes, and 1 community Thanksgiving worship service
- The new microphone was picked up, and they also fixed the other microphone at no charge since we purchased the new microphone from them.

Board of Trustees Report

- <u>Bills</u>: Bills for the month of December were provided. Total General Fund bills are estimated at \$15,376.09. This includes some of the new insurance premiums due to the change in insurance provider approved last month. It also includes a bill related the 150th Anniversary, which will be managed as a line item in the general fund. The bill for the stump removal & cement grinding and for Lynn's Woodworking will go to the Building Endowment Fund.
- <u>Balcony/Video System</u>: Carpeting has not been installed in the area where the pews were removed, and it was agreed to wait until all the final updates were done on the video and sound system as wires will need to be run for this.
- <u>Auditors</u>: Shane will be contacting people about doing this.
- <u>Electronic Payment Options</u>: The information on Tithe.ly, our electronic payment option, was printed in the newsletter, and Chris will add it to the bulletins moving forward. The information will also be in the back of church in the narthex.
- Budget Planning: The trustees will have a budget planning meeting on December 22nd.
- End of Year Dates: December 30th will be the last day for giving for 2021. Annual reports will be due on January 12th, and the annual meeting will be January 23rd.

- <u>Usage Fees for Weddings</u>: Moriah has contacted several local churches about their usage fees for weddings and other events held at the church. Board of Education Report

- <u>GLOW</u>: The number of students continues to be steady from week to week. Food and serving prep are going well; we seem to have enough help every week which is much appreciated. We would like to invite the council members to join us for GLOW supper, especially potluck on the first Wednesday of each month. The classrooms seem a bit tight for the amount of kids we have, which is a GOOD growth "problem" to have!! Something to think about in the future is trying to find some expansion for classrooms and sizes? Going forward, GLOW directors are going to help coordinate with Pastor on church items regarding or involving GLOW kids i.e. Bible distribution. As many of these types of events were cancelled last year, we want to continue to communicate expectations with everyone. We are going to start looking at the spring curriculum in the next few weeks. 2021 fall curriculum was the only curriculum purchased thus far.
- <u>Teen Power</u>: The "Shoe Away Hunger" shoe collection will start December 12th and run through February 20th; this way people can clean out closets over Christmas break. During GLOW we are practicing for the Christmas program which is on December 29th at 10 am. Weekly lessons will begin again on January 5th. We will be helping on Sunday December 5th and 19th and Wednesdays with sign-ups for the pictorial directory.
- Minneota Area Mission Trip: Fundraising for the 2023 mission trip continues. We are currently taking orders for Christmas Baking (lefse, Oreo truffles, and Belgian cookies) until Sunday, December 5th. The Baking Day will be held on Sunday, December 12th at 10:30 am at Hope Lutheran Church. We will also be serving a lunch after the Christmas program on December 19th. The Mary & Martha fundraiser we did with Nancy Krog did a total of \$3,027 in sales, and Nancy is donating \$757 to the Mission Trip. The Food at Football profit was \$2,380.16.
- Thus far 20 students have responded to the Google form regarding their preference for the type of mission experience they'd like to have.
 - 60% want a labor intensive experience
 - 25% want a combination of labor intensive and relational
 - 15% want a relational experience
- Youth of Hope: On November 21st 4 of our youth took part in our Day of Service Project. We only had one request for a project which was cleaning out a gutter at a home near the church.
- <u>Christmas program</u>: The Christmas program will be on December 19th at 10 am. Practices are underway.
- Motion made by Deb Belaen to approve the Board of Education report. Clark Corbin seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Other Business

- <u>Building and Grounds Committee</u>: The banner is now hanging up on the front of church. The other projects are on hold for right now.
- <u>Cemetery Directory</u>: The cemetery directory has been updated and a new copy will be place in the book at the cemetery. Lois VanDePutte is the treasurer for the cemetery board, and she would like to start training someone to take her place.
- <u>Church Directory</u>: Brian Jeremiason will be taking pictures, and he will also be putting the directory together. He will also take picture submissions if you already have a picture that you want to share.
- <u>Video Ministry</u>: Dave Dovre has been working with Todd Sonnenburg to get quotes on equipment to upgrade our video and sound equipment to digital. Initial estimated costs are \$9,500 for the sound system and \$10,000 for the video system. This does not include installation. The Note Gallery will also be putting together a quote. Dave Dovre will put the formal quotes together and provide it to the Endowment Fund Committee for this. The Bug Day committee is offering to buy our old sound board, also.
- <u>Nominating Committee</u>: Four people will have completed their terms on council Clark Corbin, Shane Bordewyk, Lori Dyce, and Brice Denney. Clark and Brice are completing their first terms, and Shane and Lori are completing their second terms. Terri will make the nominating committee aware of the number needed.
- Motion made by Barry Gronke to adjourn. Deb Belaen seconded the motion. Motion carried.



Do Good, Feel Good!

Do you need a New Years' Resolution? A new year, a new purpose! Give away your new or gently used shoes to help provide shoes for someone in need. Almost everyone has a closet with at least one pair of shoes that aren't worn or an old pair that may end up in a landfill. Give those shoes to Hope Lutheran Teens and know that steps are being taken to make those usable.

Hope Lutheran Teen Power is now collecting shoes for our annual shoe drive. The collection of shoes, sandals, boots, and all other footwear starts now in December and will run through February 2022. We gather footwear and deliver our donations to Schuler Shoes in St. Cloud, MN. A few years ago, one of the employees at the drop off point at Schuler Shoes shared with us that after the shoes are paired and sorted, the shoes go to four different places. The new and nicer ones may be donated to shelters and then sold at shelters for \$5.00 with the money then being donated to the shelter food shelf, some shoes stay in Minnesota with a program called 'Shoe Away Hunger', some go to other countries where they are needed for people without shoes, and the rest, if pretty worn out or are singles, are shredded and used for playground surfacing of rubber mulch.

It is estimated that approximately 400 million children worldwide, more than the entire population of the US, live in pronounced poverty. Many of these children will grow up never having had a pair of shoes, resulting in significant ramifications for their health and well-being. Lacking proper footwear, countless children will be unable to attend school. And tens of millions of these poverty stricken, barefoot boys and girls will be infected with soil-transmitted parasitic diseases like hookworm, causing lasting suffering and lifelong debilitation.

Clean out those closets and bring bags or boxes of your household's footwear to Hope Lutheran Church!
