

Secretary's Report – Motion made to approve the October and November's secretary's report made by Cory Myhre. Jason Johnson seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report

<u>Bills</u>: Bills for the month of December were presented by Cory Myhre. Total General Fund bills are estimated at \$5,703.56
 Motion made by Barb Knutson to approve the Treasurer's Report. Deb Belaen seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Board of Trustees Report

- Bills: Total General Fund bills are estimated at \$5,703.56. There were no additional bills for this month.
- <u>Pulpit Fill</u>: We have a lay minister who will be starting on Sunday, December 8th. Her name is Jennifer Warnock, and she will be coming from Madison. She is starting the process to become a minister, and she has agreed to come over for FUEL one Wednesday night per month. We will split the cost 50/50 with St. Paul's, and this is what we did previously. Bishop Dee has found a person to bless the sacraments, so Jennifer will be able to do communion. As Sunday, December 15th is the Christmas program, we won't have communion that day or December 22nd, but we will have communion on Christmas Eve.
- 2025 Budget: The proposed 2025 budget that the board of trustees put together was reviewed. The budget included the estimated cost if we get a pastor, and it also included a 3% raise for the secretary and custodian along with an increase to \$65 per service for the organist and pianist. We also increased the GLOW/Confirmation budget line item as grocery costs have increased and so curriculum can be purchased if needed. We also feel that this is an important part of our education program. The total budget approved was \$206,800.
- Motion made by Deb Belaen to approve the Board of Trustees' report. Emily Hennen seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Board of Deacons Report

- Walk Around Offerings: 4th Sunday of the month Endowment matches walk around offerings 2:1 up to \$500. There was discussion about doing the walk around differently, but it agreed that we would continue to do it the same as we have been, but we need a Temple Talk on the day of the walk around, so people know what the walk around is for.
- December Walk around offering will be done during the Christmas program and will go to GLOW/Confirmation.
- January There was discussion about doing a walk around offering to help cover costs for snow blower repair / replacement. A decision will be made in January.
- <u>Pulpit Fill / Pastor Call</u>: As mentioned earlier, Jennifer Warnock will be our lay minister starting this Sunday. The MSP (Ministry Site Profile) has been posted to the synod's website. The members of the call committee have agreed to continue to be on the committee.
- Work Groups: All the works groups for 2025 have been set up except for April.
- Motion made by Cory Myhre to approve the Board of Deacons report. Deb Belaen seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Board of Education Report

- <u>Mission Trip</u>: We are continuing to research locations and organizations. Fundraising Christmas baking will take place at Hope Lutheran Church at 10:00 am on December 8, 2024. Checks can be made out to Youth of Hope.

 - Thank you to Terri and Linday for being amazing kitchen leaders and to all the kitchen workers and help. We will continue doing assigned kitchen help in January and the rest of the GLOW year.

- First Communion Preparation -
- Lori Buysse has graciously stepped forward to teach the 5th graders their First Communion lessons. Classes will start after the new year.
- We purchased curriculum from Concordia Publish House, "This is the Feast" workbook. The cost for the curriculum and workbooks was \$210.
- FUEL contemporary worship services on Wednesday; they will be led by the lay minister in the new year.

Secretary's Report - Motion made to approve December's secretary's report by Angie DeVos. Emily Hennen seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report

- <u>Bills</u>: Bills for the month of January were presented by Cory Myhre. Total General Fund bills are estimated at \$6,518.84. **Motion made by Sandy Josephson to transfer \$30,000 from the General Fund to the Cornerstone Fund. Barb Knutson seconded the motion. Motion carried.**
- Motion made by Deb Belaen to approve the Treasurer's Report. Lizzy Reiss seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Board of Trustees Report

- <u>Bills</u>: Total General Fund bills are estimated at \$6,518.84. The only additional bill for this month is from VK Services for the website updates; the total bill was reduced by \$500 as a donation to the church.
- You Tube page: We will contact Dawn Van Keulen about removing Pastor Jon's name from the You Tube page.
- Reports & Annual Meeting: Reports are due by January 10th. The Annual Meeting is Sunday, January 26, 2025, immediately after church in the sanctuary. It was discussed about having it in the basement, but there was concern about losing too many people and there are no microphones in the basement, so it can be difficult to hear. We need 50 people for a quorum. We are also following the same agenda as last year with elections and approval of the budget first.
- Auditors: Christa Bouman and Scott Anderson have agreed to be auditors.
- Motion made by Emily Hennen to approve the Board of Trustees' report. Jen Anderson seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Addition to the Meeting

- Scott Josephson met with the council as the chairman of the Hope Mission Endowment Fund.
- The current by-laws of the Mission Endowment Fund call for the current distribution of 4.5% of the total principal of the fund:
 - 20% to local outreach
 - 20% to global outreach
 - 20% to congregational projects
 - 40% discretionary (any of the 3 other categories)
- The Mission Endowment Fund has been in place for 10 years, and the by-laws require a review every 5 years.
- Scott would like to propose changing the distribution of the Mission Endowment Fund by decreasing the congregational projects to 10% and increasing the discretionary to 50%. The main reason for this suggestion is that when the Mission Endowment Fund was established, we didn't have the Building and Property Endowment Fund, which has provided us the flexibility to cover congregational projects with this new fund.
- This change wouldn't affect the amount distributed from the Mission Endowment Fund on an annual basis.
- To make this change, the council would have to approve it and then it has to be approved by two-thirds of the congregation.
- Motion made by Aimee Ascheman to adjust the distribution of the Hope Mission Endowment Fund from 20% to 10% for congregational projects and from 40% to 50% for discretionary projects. Barb Knutson seconded the motion. Motion carried.
- This will now be brought to the congregation at the annual meeting.
- Scott will also provide an update at the annual meeting about the Bell Tower; the contractor has been having a very difficult time finding people to do the work.

Hope Lutheran Teen Power's Annual Shoe Collection

Clean out your closets and bring your shoes, boots, sandals, and other footwear to Hope Lutheran Church! Give away your gently worn shoes to help to provide shoes that aren't worn or an old pair that may end up in a landfill. Give those shoes to Hope Lutheran Teen Power and know that steps are being taken to make that footwear useable.

Hope Lutheran Teen Power is collecting footwear **now**. We will gather footwear and deliver our donations to one of the drop-off points, Schuler Shoes in St. Cloud, MN. They shared with us that after the footwear is donated, the shoes are paired and sorted, and the footwear goes to four different places. The newer ones may be donated to the shelter food shelf and then sold at shelters for \$5.00/pair. The money is then donated to the shelter's food shelf. Some of the shoes stay in Minnesota with a program called "Shoe Away Hunger", and some go to other countries where they are needed for people without shoes. The rest, if pretty worn out, or are singles, are shredded and used for playground surfacing of rubber mulch.

It is estimated that approximately 400 million children worldwide, more than the entire population of the U.S., live in poverty. Many of these children will grow up never having had a pair of shoes, resulting in significant ramifications for their health and well-being. Lacking the proper footwear, countless children will be unable to attend the school.

Please clean out your closets and bring your bags and boxes of your household's gently worn footwear to Hope Lutheran Church. Help us to promote "Shoe Away Hunger".
