- <u>Land Lease for Wind Power</u>: The contract for the wind tower lease has been signed. It will be 60 to 70 days until we receive the payment.

Board of Deacons Report

- <u>Walk Around Offerings</u>: 4th Sunday of the month. Endowment matches walk around offerings 2:1 up to \$500

- <u>Thanksgiving Ecumenical Service</u>: The service will be at St. Edward's this year, and we think it will be at 7:00 pm. That time will be confirmed at November's meeting.

Board of Education Report

- <u>GLOW</u>:

Each class has the same message, and the kids are learning one topic designed for each age group. This makes it easy to discuss what your child is learning at GLOW at home or around the dinner table.

 - The first Let It Shine Services will be held on October 15th at 9:00 am. Nona is working with the students on a "theme song" which she wrote herself. We are truly blessed to have such talent in our congregation.

A Very Healthy Group of Students

On October 1st, our 3rd graders and 7th graders were presented with age-appropriate Bibles from our church. It was exciting to watch the families and students walk to the front and receive their Bibles from their parents and receive prayers encouraging them to read these Bibles.

It was with a bit of humor when a fellow parishioner leaned forward and whispered, "I think we better continue to make quilts." Yes, there will be a need for more quilts in the future.

At the present time, your quilt makers are kind of "caught up" with the needs for next year, as there is a smaller class of graduates. But the future looks bright with the number of students in GLOW, so the work of making quilts will continue through these upcoming winter months.

There are a devoted group of members who actually make the quilt tops in their homes, during precious hours of the days and nights, that form the main part of this quilt-making process. The group actually looks ahead to the graduating classes to determine what kinds of quilts will be needed...as in floral patterns for the girls or outdoors/sports prints for the guys.

When these tops are ready, fabric is then purchased for the back of the quilt so that coordinating colors/patterns compliment the front. A call is then made to the rest of the group to gather in the church basement to assemble the tops, batting and backing. The number of members gathering varies from time to time, depending on the members' schedules.

Material for the quilt tops has been supplied by many folks in the area, and we appreciate the donation of good fabric for the quilts. But the tape, needles, thread, batting and backing are all purchased for this project.

Would you like to help? Do you have fabric you would like to donate? Do you have funds you would like to share? The quilters would appreciate your support as we share these "Hugs from Hope" for our seniors each year. Rita Dovre has been our fearless leader in the quilt project and we all appreciate the beautiful tops she and others have made over the years.

This I just one area where your HLCW (Hope Lutheran Church Women) remain active. As the quilts go out the door with the students, we hope they come to realize that they were actively cared about at Hope Lutheran.
