A Note from the Pastor

For by grace you have been saved through faith, and this is not your own doing; it is the gift of God, so that no one may boast. (Ephesians 2:8-9)

For I am not ashamed of the gospel; it is the power of God for salvation to everyone who has faith, to the Jew first and also to the Greek. For in it the righteousness of God has been revealed through faith for faith; as it is written, "The one who is righteous will live by faith." (Romans 1:16-17)

God's Word forever shall abide, No thanks to foes, who fear it; For God himself fights by our side with weapons of the Spirit...(A Mighty Fortress is our God, LBW 229)

The sin that underlies all our sins is to trust the lie of the serpent that we cannot trust the love and grace of Christ and must take matters into our own hands. (Luther)

We are saved by faith alone, but faith that saves is never alone. (Martin Luther, commentary on Galatians)

Unless I am convicted by Scripture and plain reason—I do not accept the authority of popes and councils, for they have contradicted each other—my conscience is captive to the Word of God. I cannot and I will not recant anything, for to go against conscience is neither right nor safe. Here I stand, I cannot do otherwise. God help me. Amen. (Martin Luther's reply to the Holy Roman Emperor, when called to recant his writings, 1521)

On October 31st we celebrate the beginning of the Protestant Reformation. It was on this day in 1517 when Martin Luther nailed his "95 Theses" on the church door at Wittenburg, Germany, where he was a monk and Professor of Biblical studies. The posting of this document, which dealt primarily with his objection to the sale of indulgences, drew the attention of the Pope and eventually led to Luther's excommunication from the Roman Catholic church. The sale of indulgences basically allowed people to buy forgiveness of sins, which Luther rightly saw as a violation of the scriptures and the gospel.

Pastor's Report

- 1 wedding and rehearsal, 1 funeral and funeral planning meeting, 7 pastoral visits, 2 nursing home visits, and 2 committee meetings.
- Pastor has an updated list of those who are shut-in or in the nursing home. He did service at the assisted living last week, and there were 5 from Hope. His goal for the shut-ins is to visit them once per month.
- His office hours are 8:30 to noon Tuesday through Friday, and that information will be put in the newsletter.

Treasurer's Report

- Bills Bills for the month of September were presented by Terri Gronke. Total General Fund bills are estimated at \$17.187.80.
- Motion made by Dave Dovre to approve Treasurer's Report. Barb Knutson seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Board of Trustees Report

- Bills Additional bills for this month included the copyright license, which is an annual fee. We also had the bill from Green Lake for VBS (42 students participated, which is excellent) and for Shetek for 10 campers. The bill from Mike's Flooring for the carpet stretching and installing at the parsonage will be paid from the Building Fund as that is where the insurance money was deposited. We did get a refund last month from Ottertail, so the amounts for September for the electric are estimates.
- Wireless mics The squealing from the new sound system is due to interference between our old wireless mics and the new sound system. We approved to buy one wireless mic for \$750. We currently have 3 wireless mics. It was decided to wait on the additional mics until we have an opportunity next month to review the money in the Memorial Fund for this purchase. The tv also quit, and that was shared with the Bug Days committee. The Bug Days committee purchased a new 65" tv, and we will be using that tv for now.
- Church / Parsonage Repair We didn't have an update on the church repair. We could not find matching shingles for the parsonage, so we have reopened the claim with the insurance company on this.

A Note from the Pastor (con't)

The Reformation emphasized three "solas," Sola Gratia, Sola Fide, and Sola Scriptura. In English, those are, Grace Alone, Faith Alone, and Word (Scripture) Alone. Grace is the free gift of salvation. It comes from God. it cannot be earned and it is given because of God's goodness, not because of any goodness in us. Faith is trust in God's promise of salvation. Word alone means that Scripture is the only rule and authority for the Christian life.

These "solas," sum up the way God relates to humanity. Forgiveness of sins comes not through a priest, the church, the merits of the saints, holy relics, the pope, the bishops, or even the good works of the people. The forgiveness of sins comes through the word of God, by grace, through faith. Without the Word there is no forgiveness of sins. Without the Word there are no sacraments, there is no church, there is no interaction between God and humanity.

Grace alone, Faith alone, Word alone; thanks be to God!
