

Secretary's Report: Motion made by Deb Belaen to approve the secretary's report. Angie DeVos seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report

- <u>Bills</u> Bills for the month of September were presented by Barry Gronke. The bill for VBS was adjusted to \$3,424.40 based on the \$500 down payment that was already made. It was also noted that Tim Velde's salary will go up slightly for doing the Bug Day Service and two baptisms plus mileage. Total General Fund bills are estimated at \$10,635.63. The bill for MEI for the yearly elevator service will be paid from the Building Fund.
- Motion made by Moriah Reiss to approve the Treasurer's Report. Barb Knutson seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Board of Trustees Report

- Land Lease for Wind Power: The trustees and the Endowment Fund committee met with Invenergy last week. They are working on a wind turbine project, and they presented a wind easement contract for the land that we own. They are currently in year 2 of the development phase. With each phase of the project, there are additional annual payments that we will receive. The payments are approximately \$3,700 per year during the development phase (plus a \$10k sign on bonus), \$5,200 per year during the construction phase, and \$18k per year during the operational phase if there is no wind turbine on our land. If a wind turbine was built on our land, we would receive payments of either approximately \$28k or \$38k depending on the size of the turbine. Based on the location of our land and restrictions on placement of wind turbines, there is a low probability of a wind turbine being built on our land. The land would still be available for farming even with a turbine, so there would be no loss of farm rent. Motion made by Deb Belaen to approve the contract with Invenergy for the wind easement agreement with the money to be deposited into the Cornerstone Fund until such time as the balance reaches \$50,000 or 3 months of church's monthly expenses, whichever is greater, and at that time, all additional monies will be transferred to the management of the Hope Lutheran Endowment Fund. A contract will be drafted reflecting said motion. Rose Van Uden seconded the motion. Motion carried.
- Motion made by Barb Knutson to approve the Board of Trustees report. Moriah Reiss seconded the motion. Motion carried.

- We decorate the Fellowship Hall with timely arrangements to make the area more welcoming for all ages of our members.
- We talk, we laugh, we dream, and then we put our thoughts into action to try to better our church surroundings.
