
Mission Statement

Minneota Area Mission Trip

On June 25, 2023 at 3:00 am, 33 students and 8 chaperones departed from Hope Lutheran Church. 4.0 Bus Service donated a school bus and a driver to shuttle us to Minneapolis/St. Paul Airport. Despite a four hour delay, we departed MSP and landed in Nashville, TN. We continued our journey with a 4.5 hour drive to New Beginnings Assembly of God in Grayson, KY our home for the week. We were joined by two other groups at the church, one from Michigan and one from Missouri. Our week consisted of construction, landscaping and clean-up projects in various locations around Elliott County. The worship theme of the week was "Unbelievable". Our worship time included a short video each night utilizing "street magic", card tricks to demonstrate the notion of "seeing isn't always believing and believing isn't always seeing". "God gave us our senses to see all the beauty he created ... but at some point, our senses can only take us so far - that is where faith comes in." Worship also included personal testimonies from the Next Step staff as well as singing. It was a soul searching experience for our youth and chaperones. We got to experience how our time and effort can impact those around us from building a ramp or deck for two elderly women to helping expand Next Step's mission to spread God's word throughout Elliott County, KY.

Our youth and chaperones also had the opportunity to explore Elliott County. After completing our work projects on Thursday morning, we participated in a group meal at Tierney's Cavern followed by hiking and mini golf in Carters Caves State Park. On Friday, we departed Grayson, KY bound for Louisville, KY. We were able to tour the Louisville Slugger Museum & Factory before flying home. On Aug 1, 2023, we held a Mission Trip Recap & Recruit Night at church to share our stories and pictures from our trip. We truly feel blessed by all of the support and generosity of our church parishes and surrounding communities. Our mission trips are not possible without this continued support from all of you. Thank you does not seem adequate or enough to express our gratitude. God has blessed us with amazing communities, churches, parents, and youth.

As the 2023 Elliott County, KY Mission Trip is now a memory, we are looking towards our next mission trip in 2025. We do not have a location for this trip as those will not be made available until closer to our trip (late 2024 - early 2025). As we look forward, we have started to recruit and fundraise for 2025. Any students that will be entering 8th - 12th grade this fall at Minneota Public School are eligible to attend the 2025 mission trip. Prairie Home Hospice Needs Volunteers

Barb Okrina & Gayle VanVooren, representing the HLCW, delivered a box of donations for Prairie Home Hospice in August and learned that volunteers are very needed.

The ladies met with Cory Brockman, the Marketing and Developing Coordinator for Prairie Home Hospice and were advised of the needs at their local Hospice homes.

"We really need some folks to come and help serve meals to the residents," he said, as their staff is quite limited and stretched thin with extra duties. Those helping would not make the meals but would help serve the food and do a minimal cleanup. He said that schedules would be arranged with volunteers to help in this area.

If you have an interest in sharing your time and talents, please call Prairie Home Hospice at 507-337-0080 or stop in their office at 1108 E. College Drive in Marshall between the hours of 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. While volunteers are needed, he was also extremely happy to accept the box of supplies that were delivered that day.

The Hope Lutheran Church Women have shared many items with Hospice over the years as their form of local Outreach. The box



taken in August was loaded with 297 items ranging from socks, to loofahs, shaving items, wash cloths, vanity kits, knit caps, soaps and personal care items of all kinds. Many were in the travel sizes which also work well for Hospice residents.

You can help with this project by donating items and placing them in the tote that is located in the Narthex of Hope Lutheran. Personal care items, cleaning products and paper products are all gladly received at Prairie Home Hospice. Members of the HLCW will deliver the items on a timely basis.
